#### <u>Mummers Play - outdoor performance on Bampton Fair Day 26</u> <u>October</u>

## UPCOMING PRODUCTIONS

#### "Dangerous Corner"

Unfortunately we have had to shelve plans to put on "Dangerous Corner" this Spring Despite valiant efforts by Wendy we were unable to secure the "third man" needed. We hope that we can resurrect the play at some point but it will not be in the foreseeable future

#### "Farewell to Olympus"

As a result of parking "Dangerous Corner" we now have the headroom to stage "Farewell to Olympus" - the follow up to "Trouble on Olympus" penned by our local playwright Denise Hill.

There have been no auditions for this play as the cast will be the same as for the previous production in this series to provide continuity. This will be a cut down offering rather than a full production (it will be read from scripts as is done for radio plays) and it will be performed at the Community Hall on Friday 8th March. Doors will open at 7:00pm for a 7:30pm performance.

This will not be a ticketed event; admission will be open to all Bampton Players members along with the family and friends of those taking part. Seating will be allocated on a first come, first served basis (excepting that there will be a priority given for anyone with specific access requirements). #### <u>"Pressure"</u>

We are looking to stage "Pressure" by David Haig in June 2024 to tie in with the 80th Anniversary of D-Day.

The play is based on true events that took place during World War II and centres on the true story of James Stagg and the weather forecasts that determined the date of the D-Day landings as part of Operation Overlord. It covers the personal and military stresses of Stagg, the tensions between the teams with different weather forecasts for the date of the proposed D-Day, and the events of the 72 hours leading up to D-Day are explored throughout the play.

#### "Twelfth Night"



A message from the Director:

Hi everyone - I know this is early but it would be really useful for me to gauge interest in this - particularly given with what has happened to "Dangerous Corner". I need to know I can cast "Twelfth Night" and what my options are.

We did have this show cast and ready to go before the dreaded COVID struck but I am reviewing that casting and, with only one or two exceptions, there will probably be changes in the rest of the roles as new people have joined us and some old ones have departed.

This will be the summer outdoor production at Sherwood.

The read through/casting will be on <u>Wednesday 27th March 7pm</u> at Sherwood.

If you would like to be considered for a part but can't make that date please let me know and I will arrange for you to read for me beforehand. Once cast we shall have a whole cast read through on Weds 3rd April at 7pm.

There will be targeted rehearsals for individuals and small groups from 7th April to 21st April to work on character and meaning.

All being well, whole cast rehearsals will begin on 5th May on Weds evenings and Sunday afternoons.

You don't have to be available for every rehearsal but I need to know which ones you will miss, please.

And you **MUST** be available for the whole of production week 7th-13th
